These and many other questions have been filling our rehearsal room. I invite you to give yourself time to think about this play after the show. Hang out in the Patrick Farley "Slainte!" Lobby for awhile and debate some of these ideas with friends. I also invite you to reach out if the subject matter brings up some challenging feelings and/or memories. The heart of this story is a young boy who we never actually meet onstage. No matter whose version of the story you believe, this boy has been mistreated by the adults around him. It's heartbreaking. We tell the story to try to stop the patterns in our society that have allowed this to happen. We tell this story for all the Donald Muller's out there.

Thank you for trusting New Village Arts to bring these adventurous artistic experiences to you. Thank you for being willing to think deeply about the stories we share, and please encourage your friends and families to experience DOUBT.

CREATIVES

KRISTIANNE KURNER (she/her), Director

Kristianne Kurner founded New Village Arts in 2001 and has produced over 100 shows for the company since that time. Over the years, she has served as the Managina Director, Artistic Director and for the past ten vegrs the Executive Artistic Director. She has grown the company from a 25-seat theatre with a modest budget and staff of 2 to a thriving arts center with a \$1.7 million budget and a full-time staff of 9. Kurner's work as a director has received numerous awards, including San Diego Theatre Critics Circle and KPBS Awards for Theatre Excellence, and includes regional premieres such as a new musical adaptation of Around The World in 80 Days, Conor McPherson's The Weir, John Patrick Shanley's Sailor's Song and Peter Brook and Marie-Helene Estienne's The Man Who. Most recently for NVA she directed the premiere outside of Broadway and London of Jez Butterworth's famed drama The Ferryman, which received rave reviews and sold out every performance of its six week run. Favorite acting roles include John Wesley Powell in Men On Boats and Nurse Ratched In One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest. She is a recipient of the Clare Rose Sabbatical Award from the Fieldstone Leadership Network San Diego and the Woman to Woman Award from the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce, where she serves on the Board of Directors, Kurner received her BA in Theatre from The College of William and Mary and her MFA in Acting from the Actors Studio Drama School at the New School University.

NATHAN WAITS (he/him), Stage Manager

Nathan Waits has been set building and stage managing productions around San Diego for 9 years. Previously, he has served as the master carpenter for 1222 Oceanfront, and stage manager for Desert Rock Garden, The Ferryman, and Singin' in the Rain (New Village Arts).
