DIRECTOR'S NOTE



In November of 2016, I felt compelled to take action. I was tired of just standing by as time marched on. In that moment, I felt powerless. What could I do? I'm just a normal person. Who would listen to me? Sometimes, taking a step back can give us the proper perspective to see exactly how powerful we are; even as just normal people. When I stepped back, I realized that being an artist was my power.

I feel privileged to use that power to present this play, showcasing the extraordinary and honorably revered Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who at one point, was also a normal person. We see a day in his life, as he is in the depths of the Civil Rights Movement. The struggle, the pride, the passion. It all started in his local church, because he felt compelled to take action. Whether he knew it or not, every journey starts with one step. I like to think that what truly made him extraordinary isn't just the extraordinary things he did, but that he took that first step. And after that first step, he took another. . .

Hopefully, this play will offer you some perspective, help you discover your power, and encourage you to take that first step.

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
