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



AMBER ST. JAMES (they/she), Wig Designer and Show Consultant



He also won the 1996 Tony Award for Best Musical and the 1994 Richard Rodgers Award for RENT and twice received The Gilman & Gonzales-Falla Theatre Foundation's Commendation Award. In 1989 he was granted the Stephen Sondheim Award from American Music Theatre Festival, where he contributed to the musical Sitting on the Edge of the Future. In 1988 he won the Richard Rodgers Development Grant for his rock musical Superbia, which was staged at Playwrights Horizon. He composed the score for the musical J.P. Morgan Saves the Nation, which was presented by En Garde Arts in 1995. Mr. Larson performed his rock monologue tick, tick... BOOM! at Second Stage Theatre. The Village Gate and New York Theatre Workshop. In addition to scoring and song writing for "Sesame Street", he created music for a number of children's book-cassettes, including Steven Spielberg's "An American Tail" and "Land Before Time". Other film scores include work for Rolling Stones magazine publisher Jann Wenner. He conceived, directed and wrote four original songs for "Away We Go!", a musical video for children. RENT, his rock opera based on "La Boheme", had its world premiere on February 13, 1996 at New York Theatre Workshop. Mr. Larson died unexpectedly of an aortic aneurysm on January 25, 1996, ten days before his 36th birthday. His music (including songs cut from his shows) is archived in the Library of Congress.

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THE DEA HURSTON FELLOWSHIPS



New Village Arts had the profound honor of working alongside the late Dea Hurston, a visionary arts leader who passed away last year. For over 30 years, Dea was a driving force in San Diego's arts ecology as an underwriter, arts commissioner and community advocate. As a young girl she was denied access to artistic opportunities because of the racist attitudes and laws of her time. Yet she transformed those early barriers into a lifelong mission: to open doors for others.

In January 2023, we proudly dedicated our building as the Dea Hurston New Village Arts Center, making it the first arts center in the United States outside of New York to be named in honor of a Black woman, a testament to her pioneering spirit and enduring commitment. Dea championed opportunities for women and artists of colour and left an indelible mark on our region's arts landscape.

Her legacy lives on through the **DEA HURSTON FELLOWSHIP**. Created to address the lack of paid opportunities for women, BIPOC, and other under-represented theatre artists and students working in San Diego County, the Fellowship provides paid training, mentorship, professional artistic opportunities, as well as free tickets and educational access for high-school students from underserved communities. The program spans high-school, college-level and professional artist/administrator placements, because Dea believed a more diverse theatre environment leads to richer stories and broader community impact.

Her impact endures every day: in this building, in our programs and in the countless lives she touched. We honour her memory by continuing to open doors, elevate voices and celebrate the creative spirit she so tirelessly fostered.
